

## Scriptures on Peace

Here are additional scriptures on peace from various translations of the Bible. Speak them aloud, pray them over yourself and your family, write them in your journal, meditate on them in your mind and heart, whenever you feel stressed or in need of a reminder of God's care and love for you. Choose the ones that most resonate with you. Then meditate on the amazing and peace-filled promises from the Lord in your life and ask him to help you experience them.

### **Peace (Passion translation)**

Now, because of you, Lord, I will lie down in peace and sleep comes at once, for no matter what happens, I will live unafraid! (Psalm 4:8)

This is the one who gives his strength and might to his people. This is the Lord giving us his kiss of peace. (Psalm 29:11)

But the humble of heart will inherit every promise and enjoy abundant peace. (Psalm 37:11)

He's the one who brings peace to your borders, feeding you the most excellent of fare. (Psalm 147:14)

Jesus responded, "Your faith heals you. Go in peace, with your sight restored." All at once, the man's eyes opened, and he could see again, and he began at once to follow Jesus, walking down the road with him. (Mark 10:52)

Then Jesus said to the women, "Your faith in me has given you life. Now you may leave and walk in the ways of peace." (Luke 7:50)

Jesus responded, "Beloved daughter, your faith in me has released your healing. You may go with my peace." (Luke 8:48)

"I leave the gift of peace with you—my peace. Not the kind of fragile peace given by the world, but my perfect peace. Don't yield to fear or be troubled in your hearts—instead, be courageous!" (John 14:27)

Jesus repeated his greeting, “Peace to you!” And he told them, “Just as the Father has sent me, I’m now sending you.” (John 20:21)

Be faithful to guard the sweet harmony of the Holy Spirit among you in the bonds of peace. (Ephesians 4:3)

### **Peace (The Message)**

Jonathan said, “Go in peace! The two of us have vowed friendship in God’s name, saying, ‘God will be the bond between me and you, and between my children and your children forever!’” (1 Samuel 20:42)

Turn your back on sin; do something good. Embrace peace- don’t let it get away! (Psalm 34:14)

Evil scheming distorts the schemer; peace-planning brings joy to the planner. (Proverbs 12:20)

Hot tempers start fights; a calm, cool spirit keeps the peace. (Proverbs 15:18)

“When you enter a home, greet the family, ‘Peace.’ If your greeting is received, then it’s a good place to stay. But if it’s not received, take it back and get out. Don’t impose yourself.” (Luke 10:5–6)

Eli answered her, “Go in peace. And may the God of Israel give you what you have asked of him.” (1 Samuel 1:17)

He saved you from that hard life surrounded by enemies, and you lived in peace. (1 Samuel 12:11)

I’ll enjoy peace and security as long as I live.” (2 Kings 20:19)

God makes his people strong. God gives his people peace. (Psalm 29:11)

An evasive eye is a sign of trouble ahead, but an open, face-to-face meeting results in peace.  
(Proverbs 10:10)

### **Peace (The Voice translation)**

“As for you, you will rest with your fathers in peace.” (Genesis 15:15)

“We’ll live with you in peace and become one people.” (Genesis 34:16)

“The Eternal lift up His countenance to look upon you and give you peace.” (Numbers 6:26)

“I give you the gift of peace. In the same way the Father sent Me, I am now sending you.” (John 20:21)

“Go in peace. The Eternal is watching over you on this mission.” (Judges 18:6)

“Blessed are the peacemakers—they will be called children of God.” (Matthew 5:9)

“And those who huddle in night...will be able to rise and walk in the light, guided in the pathway of peace.” (Luke 1:79)

“Your faith has liberated you. Go in peace.” (Luke 7:50)

“My peace is the legacy I leave to you. I don’t give gifts like those of this world. Do not let your heart be troubled or fearful.” (John 14:27)

### **Peace (The Amplified Bible translation)**

“Continually be at peace with one another.” (Mark 9:50)

If possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. (Romans 12:18)

May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing [through the experience of your faith] that by the power of the Holy Spirit you will abound in hope and overflow with confidence in His promises. (Romans 15:13)

May the God of peace be with you all! Amen. (Romans 15:33)

Grace to you and peace [inner calm and spiritual well-being] from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 1:3)

For God [who is the source of their prophesying] is not a God of confusion and disorder but of peace and order. (1 Corinthians 14:33)

Finally, believers, rejoice! Be made complete [be what you should be], be comforted, be like-minded, live in peace [enjoy the spiritual well-being experienced by believers who walk closely with God]; and the God of love and peace [the source of lovingkindness] will be with you. (2 Corinthians 13:11)

Grace to you and peace [inner calm and spiritual well-being] from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. (Galatians 1:3)

Peace and mercy be upon all who walk by this rule [who discipline themselves and conduct their lives by this principle], and upon the [true] Israel of God. (Galatians 6:16)

For He Himself is our peace and our bond of unity. He who made both groups [Jews and Gentiles] into one body and broke down the barrier, the dividing wall [of spiritual antagonism between us]. (Ephesians 2:14)

Now may the Lord of Peace Himself grant you His peace at all times and in every way [that peace and spiritual well-being that comes to those who walk with Him, regardless of life's circumstances]. The Lord be with you all. (2 Thessalonians 3:16)

Make every effort to keep the oneness of the Spirit in the bond of peace [each individual working together to make the whole successful.] (Ephesians 4:3)

Grace to you and peace [inner calm and spiritual well-being] from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. (Philippians 1:2)

And the peace of God [that peace which reassures the heart, that peace] which transcends all understanding, [that peace which] stands guard over your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus [is yours]. (Philippians 4:7)

The things which you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, practice these things [in daily life], and the God [who is the source] of peace and well-being will be with you. (Philippians 4:9)

I can do all things [which He has called me to do] through Him who strengthens and empowers me (to fulfill His purpose- I am self-sufficient in Christ's sufficiency; I am ready for anything and equal to anything through Him who infuses me with inner strength and confident peace.) (Philippians 4:13)
